Rabindranath Tagore's emergence as an 'educator' was completely a matter of personal development, a necessary outcome of the entire course of his life and experience.

He was born into a house, which has been a centre of numerous ethnic and social movements and a nuclear of all sorts of progressive ideas and actions. Tagore absorbed all the rich and varied elements of eastern and

western culture that made him a cosmopolitan. Tagore found his days in traditional school wasteful and oppressive. He had acquired more knowledge by self- education that gave shape and direction to his numerous powers and potentialities. He evolved as an educator par excellence. Tagore was at home in humanities as well as sciences: besides having a strong poetic sense, and in-depth intuition with philosophy and profound relation with music and arts. It was founded on 21st December, 1901 at the land purchase by his father maharshi Devendranath. Initially there were five students. All boys and all Bengalis.
